

TORAH BLESSINGS

Blessing Before Torah Reading

Ascend bimah, stand to the right of Torah reader; touch Torah text with Tallit, Siddur or Torah Binder, kiss that object and then recite in Hebrew or English:

Bar'chu et Adonai ham'vo-rach!

בְּרַכּוּ אֶת יְיָ הַמְּבֹרָךְ.

(Congregation responds, then you continue:)

Baruch Adonai ham'vo-rach l'o-lam va-ed

בָּרוּךְ יְיָ הַמְּבֹרָךְ לְעוֹלָם וָעֶד.

Baruch Atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melech

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ

ha-o-lam, a-sher ba-char banu mi-kol

הָעוֹלָם אֲשֶׁר בָּחַר בָּנוּ מִכָּל

ha'a-mim, v'na-tan lanu et Torah-to.

הָעַמִּים וְנָתַן לָנוּ אֶת תּוֹרַתּוֹ.

Baruch Atah Adonai, no-tein ha-Torah.

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ, נוֹתֵן הַתּוֹרָה.

Praise the One to whom our praise is due!

Praised be the One to whom our praise is due, now and for ever!

We praise You, Eternal God, Sovereign of the universe: You have called us to Your service by giving us the Torah. We praise You, O God, Giver of the Torah.

Blessing After Torah Reading

Upon completion of reading, touch Torah text with Tallit, Siddur or Torah Binder, kiss that object and then recite in Hebrew or English:

Baruch Atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melech

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ

ha-o-lam, a-sher na-tan la-nu Torat emet,

הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר נָתַן לָנוּ תּוֹרַת

v'cha-yei o-lam na-ta b'to-chei-nu.

אֱמֶת, וְחַיֵּי עוֹלָם נָטַע בְּתוֹכֵנוּ.

Baruch Atah Adonai, no-tein ha-Torah.

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ, נוֹתֵן הַתּוֹרָה.

We praise You, Eternal God, Sovereign of the universe, You have given us a Torah of truth, implanting within us eternal life. We praise You, O God, Giver of the Torah.

Move to other side of the lectern, next to the Cantor to watch the next Aliyah performed.
